

Writing sentences at home

You can write about whatever you like! The most important thing is that the children enjoy what they are writing about. It is also key that the children are writing manageable sentences. If they are still a little unsure, shorter sentences with simple 3-4 letter words are better. However if they are more confident, they could start to extend their sentences with 'and' or other interesting additions. If you want to link it to our learning at school

You could write about your own house, go for a walk and write about a different house, or look at a picture of a house. We have been writing sentences such as:

The house is made with bricks.

I can see bricks.

It has a red roof and a white window.

You might like to write some speech that we have learnt from the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' such as:

I will not let you in.

Little pig, little pig, let me come in.

If you want to 'freestyle'!

You could write about things you can do, things you see or descriptions of people/animals/objects. You could re-write stories/films you know off by heart or write the storyline of your role play too. Examples below:

The cat is black. The dog is brown and white. The hamster is grey with little pink feet.

I see ducks. I see dogs at the park. I see mum and dad in the garden.

I can run. I can jump and sing. I can play with my family in the kitchen.

Is there room on the broom for a frog like me? (From the story 'Room on the Broom').
