

January 2017 Suggested activities that you *may* like to do at home to support your child's Communication, Language and Literacy

1. To use **letter sounds** to write about something you have done in the holidays they you would like to share with the rest of the class. Encourage all efforts, (try **not** to tell you're child the letter sounds, but encourage them to use the sounds that they can hear nor to use the letter names) e.g. wlk - walk, cnma - cinema
2. In our classes our new groups are named after writing equipment. Can your child tell you their group name and can they do some independent writing using this equipment.
3. Share a book with your child. Can they talk about what is happening in the story and tell you their favourite character and why?
4. Please practise writing your child's name using the sound card starting at the green dot and finishing at the red like Wizzy Woo tells us to.

Suggested activities that you *may* like to do at home to support your child's Mathematical development

1. Counting sets of different objects encouraging the children to line them up and do careful counting. E.g. How many forks are on the dinner table?
2. Order numbers 1-10, then 1-20. Take out a number - can the children say the number that is missing?
3. Can your child recognise a sphere, cylinder, cube and cuboid? Can they recognise any of these in the local environment? The children can bring in pictures or photos.
